We have been asked to arrive from 12.30pm and have been allocated a room for the ladies to use (sadly no room is available for the men!). We will need to organise our seating arrangements in the Cathedral as well as where we will stand to sing too. So here is a rough guide to the times of the day:

12.30pm Arrive and find our room.

Please ensure you bring **water** for drinking, **food** for a snack lunch and wear enough **clothes to stay warm.** In my experience the cathedral is very, very cold, and whilst attending past events there I have been frozen stiff! It certainly won't help if we are sitting still or just standing around. Maybe a blanket to wrap over your knees, a warm scarf and a pair of gloves wouldn't be amiss! (memo to self: take some hand warmers for Linda Speed!). I have asked Josie to arrange the coach to take us to Gloucester for a 12.30pm arrival, so we will leave at 12noon from Drybrook Bandroom.

Visit to Witcombe Ladies Choir: Thanks to all of you who came to Witcombe Village Hall. Both Linda and I felt that we gave a good account of ourselves, and benefitted from the joint performances. It was very strange having to juggle the standing arrangements, but overall I think it worked. Tim is used to conducting his choir the way they stand, and I am used to conducting our choir standing our way. The overall sound was extremely good, and I did notice that many of their singers were looking at me and not their music. One or two said they couldn't see me and were singing 'blind' which can cause a voice to come in or hang on too long, so we will have to ensure that I am high enough for all to see. Perhaps we will be able to use the tiers that the men will have.

On the day, being confident as to where you stand to sing will be crucial to the smooth running of getting into position, so it's vital that we have been able to iron these little things out before the Concert. I have to say the beautiful sound of the Altos in This Little light of Mine made all the difference to the song. Thanks to Allison for organising the tickets and posters too. We look forward to hosting them on the 19th April.
